Since our inception, we have provided resources, education, and enrichment for close to 300 families homeschooling melanated children in the Carolinas. At Akoma Cares we prioritize diversity, equity, and inclusion with the desire to provide quality opportunities for education for all. As both Disability Advocacy Coordinator and mom of a child with Autism, it is my honor to affect positive change within the melanated neurodiverse community. # What is Neurodiversity Among Us

Neurodiversity Among Us is an annual event that aims to teach children and adults of the community about neurodiversity and acceptance in a fun and engaging way. This year we are proud partners with the Early Social Development Lab at USC Institute for Mind and Brain at the University of South Carolina as they are one of the leading contributors for active and progressive research on neurodevelopment. 2024's theme for NDAU is "Creative Art

Expression," where the world of art meets neurodiversity. Art expression is diverse much like our minds. With that in mind, we have created an event with a variety of artistic activities across artistic mediums to encourage the building of confidence, acceptance, and neurodiversity inclusion. This event welcomes families, friends, caregivers, guardians, educators, and other professionals who want to expand their knowledge and understanding of neurodiversity. It also provides the opportunity for attendees to connect with resources, quality support, advocacy, and accommodations for the melanated neurodiverse community.

We are planning for an expected number of 60 attendees at this year's NDAU event. There will be a variety of mixed media art stations like creating your own floor mural using everyday household and recyclable items to crafting your own African-inspired djembe drum. Attendees will also be able to enjoy a silent disco party led by the owner and occupational therapist of All Kinds of Minds. Everyone can listen to the music they like, at a sensory level that is comfortable for them, and still have fun and be social. There will be vendors from disability advocacy related organizations, raffle prizes, and gift bags for attendees to take home.

# Why is Neurodiversity Among Us Necessary

Neurodiversity Among Us allows us to bridge the gap between stigmatization and education in the melanated community while providing a safe and fun way for families to access the resources they need. The stigma surrounding disability—and more singularly, neurodivergence, is often thought of by many, whether consciously or subconsciously, as a state of helplessness and incapability. People of the African diaspora are often misdiagnosed based on bias and typical indicators of neurodiversity are often disregarded as behavioral or emotional disorders. Proper diagnosis, genuine acceptance, and access to resources can drastically improve the quality of life of our children and families. NDAU allows us to do just that.


#### **How You Can Support**
